
Although my name alone is on the cover of this project, it was by no means a solo effort. There is hardly enough space to list all the people that have made this possible...

The Players: The Songs: Bill Gawley Lead vocals, 6 & 12 string acoustic guitars, electric guitar, mandolin, Gawl-O-Tron, lead electric drill. I'm The One: There comes a time, despite all the masks and alter egos we try on in our everyday lives, to stand up and say "this is me- see me for what I am and we'll all get through this together".
